



The Northeast Trawl Advisory Panel (NTAP) will meet on Thursday, September 29, 2016 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The meeting will be held at the Courtyard Marriott Boston Logan Airport, 225 William McClellan Highway, Boston, MA 02128; telephone: (617) 569-5250.

Topics to be discussed at the meeting include

- membership changes;
- report of the NTAP Working Group meeting (2 August 2016);
- results of witch flounder gear efficiency study and next steps for stock assessment;
- results of research on increasing the number of survey stations;
- group discussion on initial planning for 10 to 20-day field program;
- introduction of NEFSC Working Group on transition options (i.e., to transition to industry based sampling platforms in full or in part); and
- next steps for NTAP including discussion about additional funding for future meetings.

The NTAP is a joint advisory panel of the Mid-Atlantic and New England Fishery Management Councils composed of Council members, fishing industry, academic, and government and non-government fisheries experts. The NTAP was established to bring commercial fishing, fisheries science, and fishery management professionals in the northeastern U.S. together to identify concerns about regional research survey performance and data, to identify methods to address or mitigate these concerns, and to promote mutual understanding and acceptance of the results of this work among their peers and in the broader community.

Scup Gear Restricted Areas Framework

Overview

This Framework Adjustment to the Summer Flounder, Scup, and Black Sea Bass FMP was proposed to consider modifications to the Scup Northern and Southern Gear Restricted Areas (GRAs). This action is needed to optimize the effectiveness of the current gear restricted areas (as configured) relative to updated analyses on the impact of the GRAs on the discard mortality and survival of small scup.

A GRA is an area within which individuals are prohibited from fishing for, or possessing, non-exempt species when fishing with certain types of gear. In November 2000, Scup Gear Restricted Areas (GRAs) were implemented in two areas in order to reduce discards of scup in the small mesh fisheries for Loligo squid, black sea bass, mackerel, and silver hake (mackerel were later exempted from the GRA regulations). Since then, discards of scup in the GRA areas have been reduced (in absolute estimate terms). The size,



boundaries, and other measures of the GRAs have been modified several times in response to commercial fishing industry recommendations. This action was initiated to consider options for modifying the Northern and Southern GRAs in order to optimize their effectiveness.

Action Status




Figure 1. Proposed modification to the Southern Scup GRA boundary (click to expand map).

At the April 2016 Council Meeting, the Council selected preferred alternatives and approved the Scup Gear Restricted Areas Framework for submission to the Secretary of Commerce. The Council voted to modify the boundary of the Southern Scup GRA. The proposed change, shown in Figure 1, is based on a proposal developed by members of the Council's Summer Flounder, Scup, and Black Sea Bass Advisory Panel. The proposed change to the Southern Scup GRA boundary is expected to increase the availability of longfin squid to small-mesh fisheries.

In August 2016 NOAA Fisheries announced a proposed rule to modify the Southern Scup GRAs, as recommended by the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council. Comments on the proposed rule are due September 19, 2016. Click here for details on how to submit comments.
