2014 Research Set-Aside Priorities

Interactions Between Loligo Squid, Butterfish, Atlantic Mackerel, and River Herring:

Move to delete items "Evaluate potential improvements to at-sea observer and port sampling procedures and investigate accuracy and precision of at-sea observer and port sampling based estimates of catches of butterfish and Alosine species in the Loligo fishery and Alosine species in the mackerel fishery" and "Evaluate use of videography to document Loligo catches without any or minimal butterfish bycatch". Change "Test gear modifications (in addition to mesh size) . . . " item to read "Test gear modifications (in addition to mesh size), videography and/or alternative gear types (e.g., jigging) in the Loligo squid fishery to reduce bycatch of butterfish and other species". Also, add two new recommendations to the priorities under this section: (1) "Investigate potential for industry surveys to support butterfish or squid assessments", and (2) "Investigate mesh size and/or gear technologies (grates or separators) to reduce retention of small mackerel and river herring in the mackerel fishery".

Move to include three new recommendations under Interactions Between Loligo Squid, Butterfish, Atlantic Mackerel & River Herring section: (1) "Explore spatial distribution of stock relative to the mixing of the northern and southern 'contingents' of mackerel i.e. tagging, genetics, chemical assay, microchemistry of otoliths"; (2) "Exploration of bottom trawl characteristics for catchability of mackerel"; and, (3) "Participate with industry in investigating the contemporary overlap of survey stock area, commercial fishery, and mackerel distribution and explore historical databases for the same purpose to better understand interpretation of abundance indices (survey, cpue)".

Summer Flounder:

Move to change first current item under summer flounder section to read: "Evaluate the length, weight, and age compositions of landed and discarded fish in the summer flounder fisheries (recreational and commercial) by sex. Focus age sampling on summer flounder 24 inches or larger in total length, using paired hard part samples (scales, otoliths)" and add new item "Evaluate gear modifications to reduce discard mortality in the recreational fishery".

Make suggested change to "Increase sea sampling to verify information from commercial logbooks toward providing better estimates of discards" by adding "with emphasis on pot trap and hook and line gear". Also, change "Develop fishery independent indices" to read "Evaluate and, if appropriate, continue a fixed gear survey of black sea bass similar to the one used for scup". Nolan/Heins
